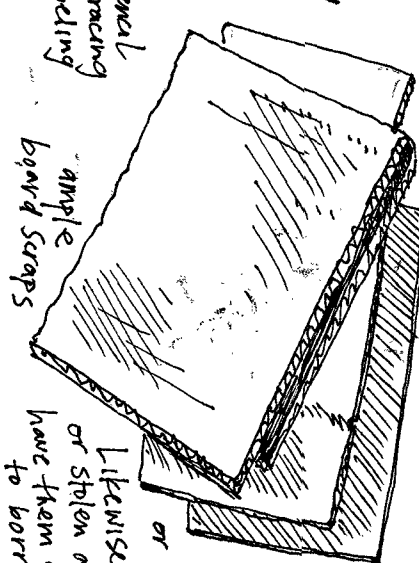
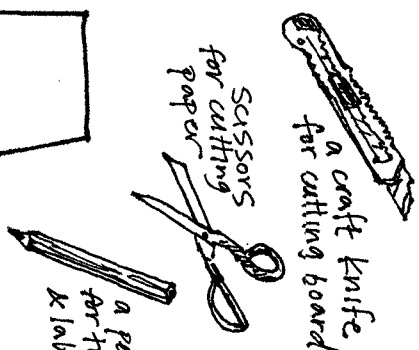


Shelf backs (cut 3)

TOOLS & MATERIALS:



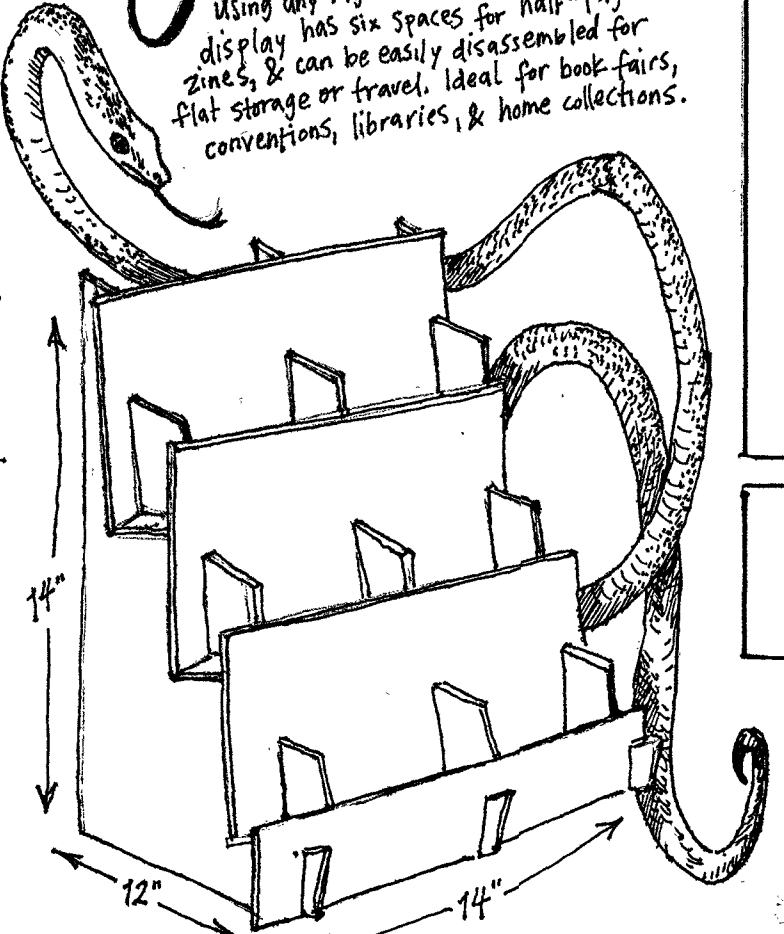
DO NOT SPEND MORE THAN \$5 TO MAKE THIS PROJECT. DO NOT MAKE IT PERFECT.

Any rigid, flat material may be used to make your display, such as cardboard, foam core, masonite, balsa wood, or matboard. These can often be had for free or cheap by trolling local dumpsters or recycling pickups. Likewise, the tools you will need may be bought or stolen almost anywhere, if you don't already have them or know anyone from whom to borrow.

Make your own zine display

A simple pattern to cut out & build using any rigid material. The finished display has six spaces for half-page zines, & can be easily disassembled for flat storage or travel. Ideal for book fairs, conventions, libraries, & home collections.

In addition, this pamphlet, if you need only the following commonplace items to complete the project pictured here: scissors, a pencil, a craft knife, a cutting surface, and ample scrap cardboard.

Try making the very back panel extra tall and turn it into a fancy sign that sticks up behind your books!

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Cut out all pattern pieces & trace them onto board, discreetly labeling them as indicated.
2. With a sturdy craft knife, carefully cut out all board pieces. There will be 10 pieces altogether.
3. Assemble the display by first matching all A slots from back to front, followed by all B slots. If any pieces don't fit, trim them until they do.
4. Reinforce any loose spots using extra cardboard scraps, tape, or toothpicks/splints.
5. Fill your display with books. Hooray!

NICE JOB

All of these slots should match the thickness of your board material, so adjust your pattern accordingly
